## HISTORY

In the AHA Guidelines Conference in 1992, more than 40% of the participants were from outside the United States. Researchers from many countries contributed to the scientific foundation for resuscitation practice. During this conference, a panel on international cooperation endorsed the need to foster a global evidence base for resuscitation practices. This panel also recommended that an expanded group of international experts conduct a systematic review of the world's resuscitation literature. A mechanism was recommended to capture and assess the growing body of evidence. Douglas Chamberlain and Richard O. Cummins were nominated as founding co-chairs of this International Liaison Committee. Under the leadership of panel members, including Richard O. Cummins, Douglas Chamberlain, William Montgomery, and Walter Kloeck, the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR) was formed. The founding member organizations of ILCOR were the American Heart Association, the European Resuscitation Council, the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, the Resuscitation Council of Southern Africa, and the Australian Resuscitation Council. These organizations were later joined by the Consejo Latino-Americano de Resuscitation (which now forms part of the Inter-American Heart Foundation) and the New Zealand Resuscitation Council.

The first resuscitation guideline under the umbrella of ILCOR:

The problems in resuscitation are similar worldwide. It was stressed that wisdom, knowledge, or experience should not be the monopoly of anyone, and all should work effectively together for the good of all. ILCOR was thus formed with the belief that the evaluation by a joint group of experts should lead to the best evidence-based resuscitation guidelines and practices. In 2000, the first resuscitation guideline under the auspices of ILCOR was issued. A sophisticated process for gathering and assessing evidence was adopted, which evolved further in 2005. The conference participants identified knowledge gaps and incorporated different evidence levels into a consensus treatment statement.

They also review immediate and ICU management of the post-arrest patient, including blood pressure, ventilation management, and neuroprognostication.

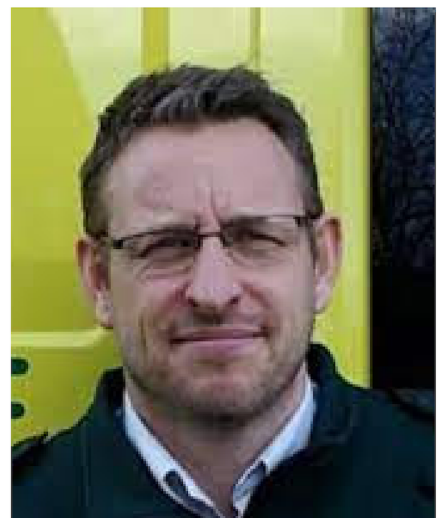
## BASIC LIFE SUPPORT

The Task Force conducts annual systematic reviews, scoping reviews, or evidence updates to provide up-to-date treatment recommendations for guideline providers.

# RESEARCH AND REGISTRIES COMMITTEE

## COMMISSION

### MISSION:

- There is a need for an evidence-based approach to improve systems of care and survival.
- ILCOR is in a leadership position to drive the international research agenda to identify and prioritize gaps in knowledge related to resuscitation and first aid practices. We have the opportunity to foster and facilitate international research collaboration with consensus operational definitions, registry data (national and international registries) for benchmarking, quality improvement, and research. Furthermore, it is essential that we measure and disseminate progress towards our vision of saving more lives through resuscitation.
- In an effort to collect descriptive data on systems of care and outcomes following OHCA/IHCA, we are committed to advancing our research and registries mandate. This will involve continued development of consensus operational definitions and reporting templates, and collection of summary data on process of care and patient outcomes from registries around the world.
- Several challenges that we will need to address include integrity of the data, permission to access data from registries, data integration, and funding and regulatory challenges associated with holding or displaying data.

# RESEARCH AND REGISTRIES COMMITTEE

## RESPONSIBILITIES

### OBJECTIVES:

- Contribute to the collection of data from existing registries of both out- and in-hospital cardiac arrests throughout the world.
- Contribute to a description of the epidemiology and outcome of out- or in-hospital cardiac arrests across world by use of registry data.
- Communicate with ILCOR members on the process of data collection and utilization through research and registries, and/or improve the quality of research and registries, to improve survival from cardiac arrests with an evidence-based approach.
- Review/Approve annual report that describes out-of/in-hospital cardiac arrests across world.
- Synthesis of OHCA/IHCA registries worldwide.
- Increased international research collaborations
- Better understanding of existing epidemiology of OHCA/IHCA and associated trends
- Measure and report progress toward vision of saving more lives globally through resuscitation
- Discuss and suggest how to develop research and registries for out-of/in-hospital cardiac arrests across the world, with the aim of using an evidence-based approach to improve survival after cardiac arrest.
- Contribute to periodic publication.

# SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE

## MISSION, OBJECTIVES, RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Attend assigned Task force (TF) meetings and maintain close communication with TF Chair to meet the needs of the TF.
2. Guide and approve TF development of Consensus on Science with Treatment Recommendations PICOSTs.
3. Review and approve and guide TF led Evidence Updates, TF led Systematic Review (SRs,) and TF led Scoping Reviews prior to submission to Scientific advisory Committee ( SAC )and for public comment, peer review, or publication.
4. Oversee and coordinate the activities relevant to the ILCOR approved Continuous Evidence Evaluation (CEE) process at the level of the TF
  - a. *Guides TF members in development of PICOST ((Population, Intervention, Control, Outcomes, Study design and Timeframe and Search Strategy*
  - b. *Approves all assignment of PICOSTs to Knowledge Synthesis Unit (KSU )or Expert Systematic Reviewer ESRs*
  - c. *Present PICOST to SAC for review*
  - d. *Guides TF in the development of Evidence to Decision (EtD) Tables, and (CoSTRs)*
  - e. *Reviews/Approves all completed systematic reviews prior to submission for peer review and reviews and approves all CoSTRs and EtD tables prior to submission to the Board for approval and posting on ilcor.org*
  - f. *Monitor (through the biweekly SAC meetings) the projects of other TFs to connect TFs to nodal reviews.*
  - g. *Monitor new developments in evidence review methodologies and opportunities to determine and adjust the ILCOR Continuous Evidence Evaluation (CEE) process appropriately.*

## SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE

A. Assist SAC in the activities that follow:

1. Provide science input into ILCOR's strategic planning process and assure that ILCOR's CEE priorities are appropriately reflected in the ILCOR strategic plan.
2. Make recommendations regarding candidates for Expert Systematic Reviewers, and Knowledge Synthesis Units contributing to the CEE process recruited in accordance with the ILCOR policy on appointment.
3. Ensure compliance with Conflict of Interest (COI) principles in all CEE activities.
4. Assumes other responsibilities as assigned by the ILCOR Board.
5. Oversee and coordinate the activities relevant to the ILCOR approved CEE process and this includes measuring and reporting to ILCOR Board/SAC Chair predefined CEE process metrics.

Provide leadership for the working group.

Facilitate communication and discussion during the meetings.

Serve as spokesperson within the organization for the working group.

Facilitate the meeting according to the agenda.

Create the agenda in partnership with staff support.

Provide research as needed for the working group.

Bring the viewpoint of the Board of Directors to the working group discussion.

Bring action items and recommendations from the working group to the Board when necessary.

Report Board decisions back to the working group.

### Members:

Identify potential individual donors and businesses who could potentially provide resources to ILCOR.

Create and organize activities to raise funds for ILCOR.

Identify other fundraising opportunities available in the community and coordinate ILCOR's presence or involvement.

Work with the honorary treasurer to ensure that processes are in place for donor recognition, Belgium substantiation and categorized record keeping by source of income and donor.

Maintain records of where contacts have been made to avoid duplication of effort. Expresses ideas and provides input.

Actively participates in meetings, contributing to the discussion, brainstorming and sharing innovative ideas.

Reviews material and provides input for improvement.

Serves as internal/external linkages for Fundraising working group to open doors to further ILCOR's mission and vision.

Co Chairman Prof Brend Bottiger World Restart a Heart (WRAH) is an initiative of the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR). WRAH has been celebrated every year on 16 October since 2018. ILCOR shares resources and enthuses and motivates regional resuscitation councils to become involved in this worldwide campaign. Involvement with WRAH is voluntary for national resuscitation councils, and they are encouraged to develop strategies for their own countries. Not all activities have to occur on a particular day, but 16 October is used to celebrate and focus media activity on spreading the message of WRAH.

Activities are not restricted to school children. ILCOR has a media strategy for WRAH, which includes media packs, sample letters to schools, etc., and all these are shared with members.

All seven constituent councils of ILCOR as well as India, Arabic countries and many more are supporting this global initiative to increase awareness about the importance of bystander CPR and to also increase actual bystander CPR rates worldwide. In 2022, we are on our fifth global edition, and the tenth anniversary of the first European Restart A Heart Day!

Using the hashtag #CPRSavedMyLife, we are once more gathering stories of survivors who are still with us today thanks to bystander CPR and once more underline the vital importance of

CPR in out-of-hospital settings. By starting CPR and using a defibrillator before emergency services arrive, we can save up to 200 000 more lives every year. Make sure you know what to do – learn CPR!

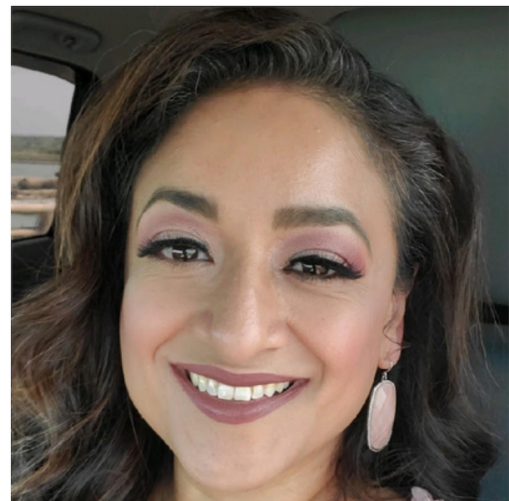

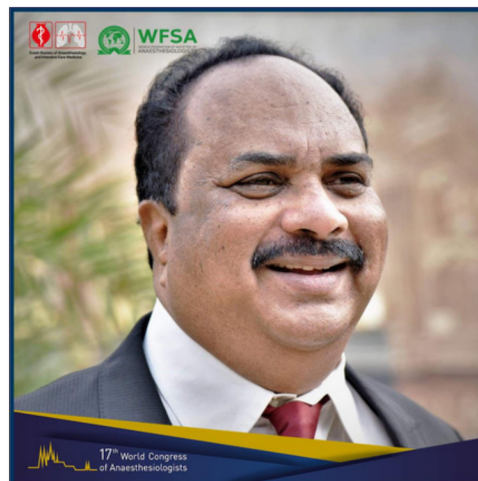
